



The Wool (as described by the Romney Association)

A desirable feature of Romney is the wool can range 30 to 40 micron (44's to 58's) depending on individual strains of Romney. The fleece should be bright and white, dense with free opening well defined staples that are full and oval shaped, not flat. In addition to being white, semi lustrous and soft, it should have the necessary bulk and handle that is expected of wool of comparable micron. Uniformity of coverage is essential, and quality should be maintained from the shoulder to the back of the flank.
